



BROW LAMINATION

Patient Pre- and Post-Care Instructions

PRE-CARE: Preparing for Your Appointment

To ensure the best results and your safety, please review the following requirements. This treatment is not recommended if you have any of the following:

- Sensitive skin or history of eczema/psoriasis around the eyes.
- Recent eye surgery or permanent makeup (within the last 6 weeks).
- Allergies to hair dye, tint, or perming solutions.
- Currently pregnant or breastfeeding (hormonal changes can affect hair lift).

Important Skincare Timeline:

- Retin-A / Retinols: Must stop 7 days prior. May resume after 72 hours.
- AHAs / BHAs (Glycolic, Salicylic, etc.): Must stop 7 days prior. May resume after 72 hours.

Additional Pre-Care:

- Arrive Clean: Ensure the brow area is free of makeup, pencils, and oils.
 - Avoid Hair Removal: Refrain from waxing or threading for 1 week prior.
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POST-CARE: The Critical First 24 Hours

Brow lamination is a chemical process that reshapes the hair. The first 24 hours are vital:

- Keep Them Dry: Do not get your brows wet. Avoid steam, heavy sweating, swimming, or washing the brow area.
- Do Not Touch: Avoid rubbing or touching the brow hairs. The shape is still setting.
- Avoid Makeup: Do not apply brow gel, pencils, or heavy creams to the area.
- Sleep on Your Back: Prevent the hairs from being crushed or bent out of shape overnight.

LONG-TERM MAINTENANCE

- Hydrate Daily: Starting 24 hours after your service, you must apply a nourishing oil (such as Castor or Argan oil) daily to keep hairs healthy and prevent brittleness.
- Resume Skincare: You may resume Retinoids and Acids 72 hours after your service, keeping them away from the brow hairs.
- Brush Daily: Use a clean spoolie brush to style your brows every morning.
- Maintenance: Results last 4–8 weeks. Do not re-laminate sooner than 6 weeks.
